Academic Senate Resolution 14-15 FAC 10, Inclusion of the Administrative Review of the Director of Sustainability under UARC Review; Suggested Changes to the *Policies and Procedures Governing Faculty Participation in Appointment and Review of Administrative Officers of CSUEB*

Upon review of Academic Senate Resolutions 14-15 FAC 5 and 14-15 FAC 10, I respectfully reject the resolution and provide the rationale for my decision below.

As I mentioned in my memo dated June 17, 2015 addressing 14-15 FAC 4, I welcome the opportunity to discuss the *Policies and Procedures Governing Faculty Participation in Appointment and Review of Administrative Officers of CSUEB* with the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate in the near future. Until that meeting occurs, I am averse to expanding the scope of the document.

Given the context of the resolution, and while I appreciate the work done by the Academic Senate, I cannot currently accept Academic Senate Resolution 14-15 FAC 5, Inclusion of the Administrative Review of the University Diversity Officer under UARC Review; Suggested Changes to the *Policies and Procedures Governing Faculty Participation in Appointment and Review of Administrative Officers of CSUEB* and Academic Senate Resolution 14-15 FAC 10, Inclusion of the Administrative Review of the Director of Sustainability under UARC Review; Suggested Changes to the *Policies*

and Procedures Governing Faculty Participation in Appointment and Review of Administrative Officers of CSUEB adopted by the CSUEB Academic Senate on May 19, 2015.
