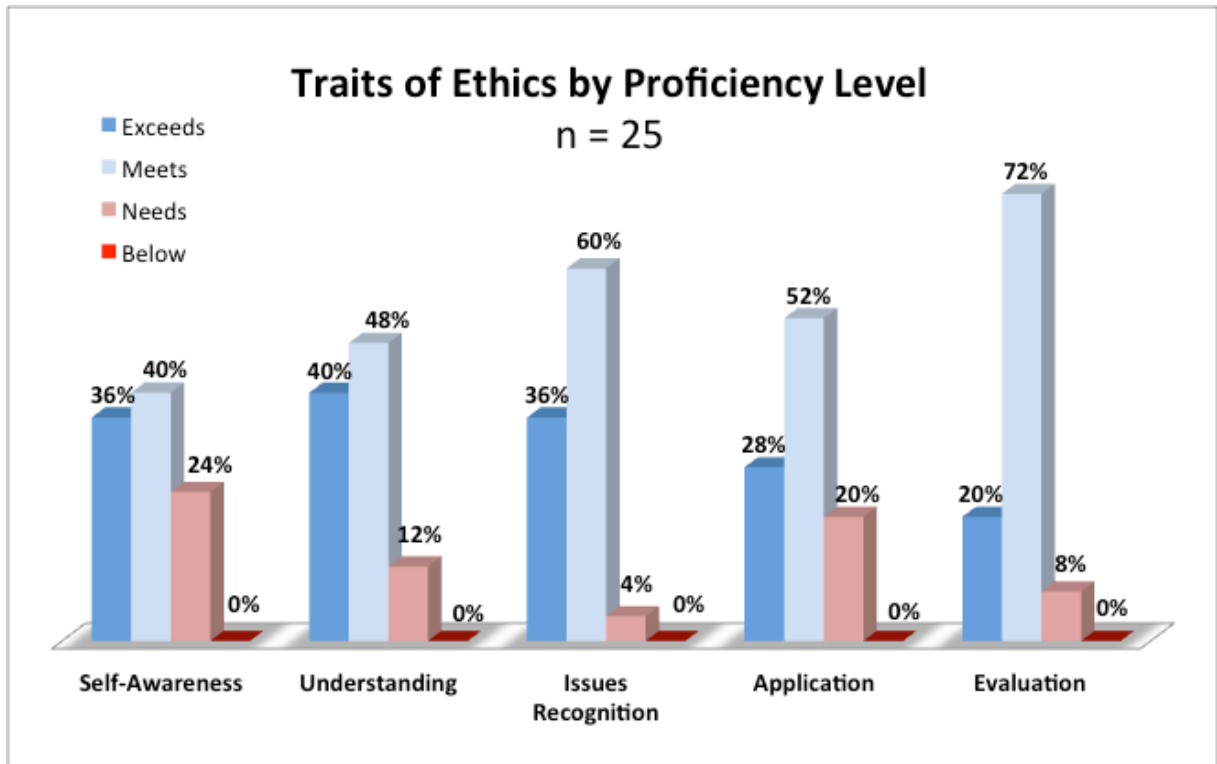
Data Summary & Analysis Tables and Graphics:

There are two targets set for this skill, (1) 70% of students will meet or exceed expectations; and (2) less than 10% of students will score “1” (below expectations) on any “trait” in the rubric. Overall, 80% of students met expectations on the learning objective.

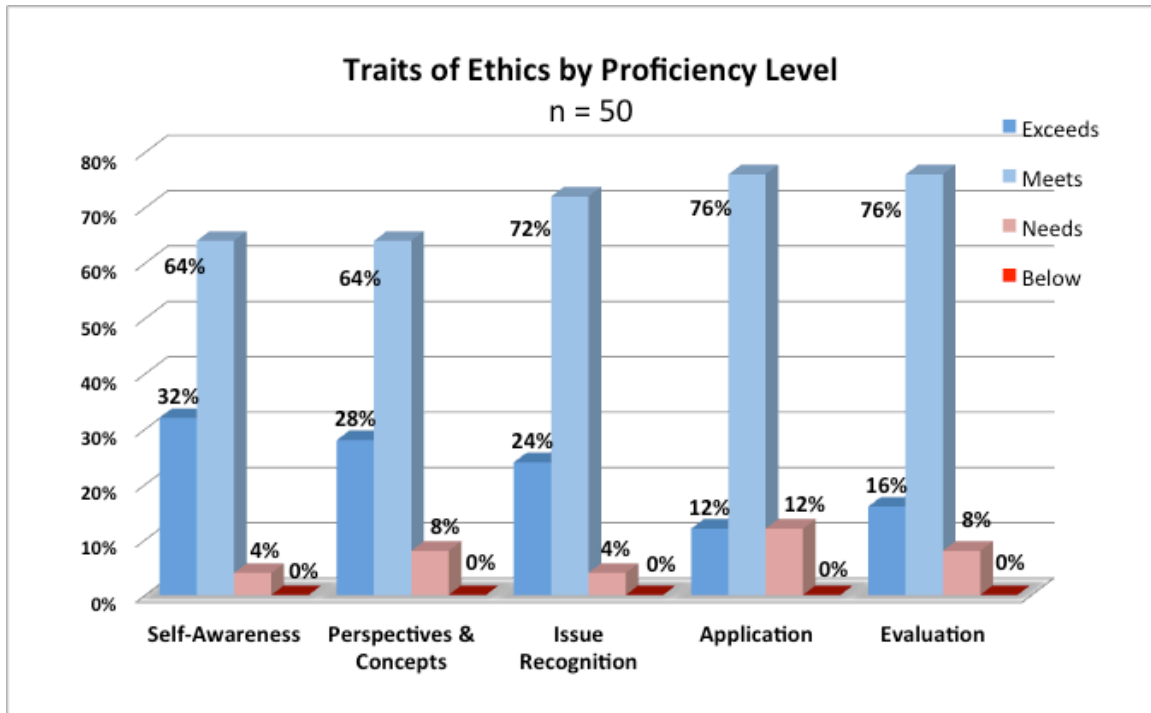
