Faculty member #2, selected by Program Director/Chair, will assess artifacts using the selected assessment measurement tool, an externally adopted rubric appropriate for the accurate measurement of the learning objective within the program.


Assessment Measurement Tool Used: Externally adopted rubric.

Status of Assessment: Completed.



Performance Targets: 70% of students meet or exceed expectations.


Data Summary & Analysis:



The proficiency target for learning objective 4A: Written Communication is set that 70% of students receiving an overall score of meeting or exceeding expectations on the specific learning objective. Results show students clearly meeting the benchmark with 94% of students meeting/exceeding.



Assessment results for the learning objective overall show 70% of assessed students meeting expectations, with 24% exceeding expectations, and only 5% of assessed students below expectations.



Analysis from each individual trait shows each trait measuring relatively consistently; no trait strayed far from the results of the other traits for 'meeting' and 'exceeding' expectations. However, when it came to 'below' expectations, Trait #2: Organization & Logic, led with 11 percentage points in number of students assessed with a score of 0 to 2. Trait #4: Sentence Structure showed the lowest percentage (27%) of students meeting expectations by comparison to all other traits.


Conclusions:


Overall, students are meeting proficiency targets for learning objective 4A: Written Comm. One area highlighted for suggested improvement involves Trait#2: Organization & Logic and Trait #4: Sentence Structure.
