
Assessment Measurement Tool Used: Externally adopted rubric. Modified by department.

Status of Assessment: Completed.


Artifacts Archived: Scores recorded and archived.

Data Summary & Analysis:




The proficiency target for learning objective 4A: Written Communication is set that 70% of students receive an overall score of meeting or exceeding expectations on the specific learning objective. Results show students clearly meeting the benchmark with 94% of students meeting/exceeding. The same findings that were found in the last round of assessment.



Overall assessment results for the learning objective show 61% of assessed students meeting expectations, with 33% exceeding expectations, and 6% of assessed students below expectations. This is an increase in percentage of students exceeding expectations compared to the last round of data collection.

The graphic below display the findings for each individual trait as it is compared with the performance of other traits. When it came to 'below' expectations, Trait #1: Thesis/Opening had the highest amount of students assessed between 0 and 2 points. However, it also had one of the highest percentages in terms of exceeding expectations with 39% of students scoring between 6 and 8 points. Trait #2: Organization & Logic improved from the previous assessment cycle.




Conclusions:


