Assessing faculty observed student presentations and assessed for learning objective proficiency, while teaching faculty assessed for assignment grade.


Assessment Measurement Tool Used: Externally adopted rubric. Modified by department.

Status of Assessment: Completed.


Artifacts Archived: Scores received and archived.

Data Summary & Analysis:




The proficiency target for learning objective 4B: Oral Communication is set that 70% of students receive an overall score of meeting or exceeding expectations on the specific learning objective. Results show students clearly meeting the benchmark with 100% of students meeting/exceeding.



Overall assessment results for the learning objective show 79% of assessed students meeting expectations, with 21% exceeding expectations, and 0% of assessed students below expectations. This is an improvement in the area of below expectations.

The graphic below display the findings for each individual trait as it is compared with the performance of other traits. When it came to 'below' expectations, Trait #4: Style and Trait #5 had the largest number of students receiving 0 to 2 points. Contrastingly, students overwhelmingly performed very well in time management with 97% of students exceeding expectations on this particular trait.




Conclusions:


