

- Completion of **Cal-GETC** will permit a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the University of California (UC) or the California State University (CSU) without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower division general education courses.
- A minimum of 60 UC/CSU transferable units is generally required for transfer. For other transfer requirements, please see a counselor.
- Cal-GETC may not be recommended for some majors.
- The course requirements for **ALL** areas must be completed **PRIOR** to transferring to the CSU or UC for Cal-GETC to be certified.
- All courses must be completed with a **grade of "C" or better**.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** UC and CSU are still reviewing courses for Cal-GETC approval. This form is subject to change.
