California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) Pattern 2025-2026

The Completion of the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) Pattern will permit a student to transfer from Columbia College to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus or program without the need, in most cases, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

Cal-GETC Certification

A minimum “C” grade is required in each college course for Cal-GETC. A “C” is defined as a minimum of 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale. A “C-” grade valued at less than 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale cannot be used for Cal-GETC certification.

Courses in which a student receives a “P/NP” (Pass/No Pass) grade may be used toward Cal-GETC certification. Students should be aware that CSU and UC campuses may have limitations on the number of P/NP grades accepted to satisfy transfer, major, and graduation requirements at those institutions.

NOTE:

- Students transferring to a CSU who have Cal-GETC certified as complete will still need to complete requirements at that college. These often include completing nine (9) semester units of upper-division general education (GE) after transfer. There may also be additional campus- or major-specific graduation requirements beyond general education coursework.
