

## California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC)

Completion of Cal-GETC will permit a student to transfer from a California Community College (CCC) to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus or program without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

Although it is strongly recommended that students complete Cal-GETC prior to transfer, completion of Cal-GETC may not be appropriate for some engineering, math, science, or other high unit majors. Some individual colleges or majors within a UC campus may not accept or recommend Cal-GETC to fulfill all of their general education requirements. See a counselor to discuss the best path for you.

All courses must be completed with grades of "C" or better. Courses appearing in more than one area may be used to satisfy only <u>one</u> area. The (^) notation indicates that transfer credit may be limited by UC. See a counselor for details.
