1) Complete a college-level language course with a grade of "C" or better (or "P" if Pass = C). 2) Complete two years of a high school language course with a grade of "C-" or better. 3) Earn a qualifying score on an approved external exam (e.g., AP, IB, etc.). California General Education Transfer Curriculum 2025-2026

The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (**CalGETC**) is a general education pattern that allows California community college students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements for transfer to both California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC) campuses. CalGETC provides a well-rounded academic foundation by including coursework in: English Communication, Quantitative & Scientific Reasoning, Arts & Humanities, Social & Behavioral Sciences, and Ethnic studies.

Hartnell College CalGETC has a total of 34 units and includes the following areas:

Area 1: English Communication

- o 1A: English Composition
- o 1B: Critical Thinking & Composition
- o 1C: Oral Communication

Area 2: Mathematical Concepts & Quantitative Reasoning

Area 3: Arts & Humanities

- o 3A: Arts
- 3B: Humanities

Area 4: Social & Behavioral Sciences

o 2 courses from 2 different disciplines

Area 5: Physical & Biological Sciences

- o 5A: Physical Science
- 5B: Biological Science
- 5C: Science Laboratory

Area 6: Ethnic Studies

CalGETC Certification: Certification means that Hartnell College has officially verified that a student has completed the lower-division general education requirements for transfer to a University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) campus under the CalGETC pattern.

Why Certification Matters: Certification is essential because, without it, students may be required to complete additional lower-division general education courses after transferring. A certified CalGETC pattern confirms that general education requirements have been fulfilled at the community college level

Pass-Along Certification: Including Coursework from Other Colleges Courses taken at other colleges or universities may be considered for CalGETC certification through a process known as pass-along certification:

- Courses from other California Community Colleges will be certified in the same CalGETC areas (Areas 1-6) that were approved by the original institution.
- Courses from other regionally accredited colleges or universities may be certified only if they are determined to be equivalent to courses on Hartnell College's CalGETC approved list.

CalGETC Guidelines

- Complete one course in each required CalGETC area.
- Courses must be on the approved CalGETC list for the term in which they were taken.
- A grade of "C" or better is required in all CalGETC courses.
- Double-counting of courses is permitted between CalGETC and major preparation, but not within multiple GE areas, even if a course is listed in more than one area; it can only be used to satisfy one GE area.
- Certification of CalGETC completion will be awarded by Admissions and Records if all requirements have been met.

Please Note:

- Courses marked with an asterisk (**) indicate transfer unit limitations by the CSU, UC, or both. Consult with a counselor for detailed guidance.
- Appropriate documentation must be on file with Admissions and Records to apply external credit or complete certification.
- See a counselor for personalized academic planning and to ensure you meet all transfer requirements.
- CalGETC may not be accepted for certain majors at UC,

External Examinations and CalGETC

Certain external examinations may be used to satisfy specific CalGETC general education requirements, provided the required minimum scores are met. These include:

- Advanced Placement (AP)
- International Baccalaureate (IB)

- The list of approved exams
- Minimum score requirements
- Equivalent CalGETC areas satisfied
- Unit limitations for CSU and UC transfer

Please Note: Unit credit granted through external exams may have limitations set by the CSU or UC system. Always consult with a Counselor to confirm how exams apply to your specific educational plan.
