CAL-GETC CERTIFICATION AND CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT

The California - General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is a general education (GE) pattern that allows California Community College students to complete lower-division general education (GE) requirements for the CSU and UC. With full certification — which includes completing all areas with at least 37 units and minimum grades of "C" or "P" - students will not need to complete additional lower-division GE requirements after transfer.

Cal-GETC is not an admission requirement or admission guarantee for transfer to the CSU or UC, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower-division GE requirements for the CSU or UC. However, for students who start (or return after a break in attendance) in <u>Fall 2025</u>, Cal-GETC is required if pursuing an Associate Degree for Transfer. Completion of these requirements also satisfy requirements for Certificate of Achievement in Transfer Studies – Cal-GETC.

To transfer to a CSU or UC with junior status, students must complete sixty (60) transferable units of Major and GE courses with minimum grades of "C" or "P" (no more than 14 units of "P" grades). Transfer seeking students should: (1) meet with a counselor to create an **EDUCATIONAL PLAN** that will assist in identifying appropriate major and GE requirements; (2) request a **Cal-GETC Certification** (when requesting final transcripts) to be sent to the transfer institution; and (3) with a counselor's assistance, determine eligibility for an Associate's Degree and/or an additional Associate's Degree for Transfer.

- 5. Verified competency by a CCC, CSU or UC faculty member. See a counselor for assistance.
