



Cal-GETC Pattern

Completion of the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) will permit a student to transfer from a California Community College (CCC) to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus or program generally without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. Note: Students transferring to a CSU who have Cal-GETC certified as complete will still need to complete 9 semester units of upper-division general education (GE) after transfer and may also be held to other campus specific graduation requirements outside of general education and major coursework.

A minimum “C” grade is required in each college course for Cal-GETC. A “C” is defined as a minimum of 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale. A “C-” grade valued at less than 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale cannot be used for Cal-GETC certification. Complete a guidance class or meet with a counselor to accurately plan coursework to satisfy transfer admission and upper-division major requirements. Courses in which a student receives a “P/NP” (pass/no-pass) grade may be used toward Cal-GETC certification, but be advised that CSU and UC campuses may have limitation on the number of P/NP grades accepted to satisfy transfer, major, and graduation requirements at those institutions.

Additional Transfer Preparation

LOTE: Language Other than English (for the UC system)

Students who plan to transfer to UC to earn a baccalaureate degree must demonstrate proficiency in a language other than English (LOTE) equal or beyond two years (or through the second level of high school instruction) to satisfy UC’s requirements for baccalaureate degree.

Students who did not meet the LOTE requirement in high school may satisfy UC’s LOTE requirement by completing a college course/courses, or by demonstrating proficiency using one of several other methods

About the LOTE Requirement

The LOTE/UC-E subject requirement aims to improve students’ knowledge of language structure as a whole, while improving their cultural awareness and literacy in a second language in an effort to develop the global awareness necessary for success in an interconnected world.

Coursework

High School Courses

In a high school where the language of instruction is English, completion of the second level of high school coursework in a language other than English with a letter grade of “C-” or better in the second semester of the second year.

In an institution where the language of instruction is not English, formal schooling through the sixth-grade level or higher.

Appropriate documentation must be presented to substantiate the language of instruction. If an official sealed transcript cannot be obtained from an international institution, an unofficial or opened transcript may be used, as appropriate.

Other

Satisfactory completion of an achievement test administered by a community college, university, or other college in a language other than English. The test must assess the student’s proficiency at the level equivalent to two years of high school language. Determinations must be posted on a transcript indicating units, course title and grade or on official college letterhead of the institution granting proficiency stating that the student has mastered proficiency in the language equivalent to two years of high school language.

If an achievement test is not available, a faculty member associated with a United States regionally accredited institution of higher education can verify a student’s competency. The institution must provide a document on college letterhead asserting that the student has mastered proficiency in the language equivalent to two years/second level of high school instruction.

U.S History, Constitution and American Ideals (AI) Requirement for CSU Baccalaureate degree

Students who plan to transfer to the CSU system to earn a baccalaureate degree can complete MJC courses to satisfy CSU-specific requirements for the baccalaureate degree (Title 5 §40404). The CSU Requirement in U.S. History, Constitutions, and American Ideals requirement includes courses that

- address the historical development of American institutions and ideals
- address the Constitution of the United States, the operation of representative democratic government under that Constitution, and the process of California state and local government
