## California General Education Transfer Curriculum (CalGETC) 2025 – 2026

The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (CalGETC) is a general education pattern that will fulfill all lower-division general education requirements at all California State University (CSU) campuses and most University of California (UC) campuses/majors. Students should inquire about whether some requirements may be fulfilled using external exam credit, or another regionally accredited college course. CalGETC is also accepted by some private/independent or out of state universities. Completion of the CalGETC pattern is not an admission requirement for transfer to most UC or CSU campuses, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower division GE requirements of a UC or CSU campus prior to transfer. **Please review the San Diego Miramar College Catalog and/or ASSIST.org for complete information.**

The California State University, before awarding a degree, requires students to complete courses or examinations that address:

This requirement is not part of CalGETC, but may be fulfilled at a California Community College prior to transfer by completing a combination of the courses listed below that satisfies all three areas of the requirement. The requirement may also be completed at a CSU after transfer. Students who have completed equivalent courses outside the State of California must complete a course from Area US-3.

### (UC Graduation Requirement)

#### (Optional) – UC Graduation Requirement: Language Other Than English (LOTE)

- Not part of CalGETC; may be completed prior to transfer
- Proficiency equivalent to two years of high school study in the same language with a minimum grade of “C” or better.
