

## MONICA The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) 2025-2026

This pattern is for students who began a California Community College Fall 2025 or later, or those who have not maintained catalog rights. See a counselor for details.

The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is the singular general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements for both the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC). The curriculum and its policies are overseen by the Intersegmental Committee of the Academic Senates (ICAS), representing faculty from California's three segments of public higher education.

Courses completed at a California Community College will be applied to the subject area in which they were listed by the institution where the work was completed – see ASSIST.org. Coursework from other United States Institutionally accredited, (formerly regionally accredited) institutions may be used on Cal-GETC. Coursework must be evaluated by a counselor. All courses must be completed with a grade of C (2.0) or higher. A "Credit" or "Pass" that is defined by institutional policy as being equivalent to a grade of C (2.0) or higher may be applied to meet Cal-GETC requirements. Foreign coursework from non-institutionally accredited institutions (formerly **US regionally accredited institutions) may not be used.** Course credit earned on the basis of acceptable scores on Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB) exams can be applied toward Cal-GETC certification:

## Cal-GETC CERTIFICATION

The Cal-GETC requirements must be completed and certified prior to transfer. "Certification" means that the last California Community College a student attended for a regular term (Fall or Spring for semester schools or Fall, Winter, Spring for quarter schools) prior to transfer to the UC or CSU system will verify that the student has completed the Cal-GETC requirements. It is the student's responsibility to request Cal-GETC certification from SMC to the university that the student will be attending. Note that Cal-GETC is not a UC admission requirement.

Before petitioning for Cal-GETC certification, students are strongly urged to consult with their Santa Monica College counselor and verify that they have fulfilled their Cal-GETC requirements.

## The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) Requirements

All courses must be completed with a grade of C (2.0) or higher. Courses used to meet Cal-GETC requirements must have a minimum of 3 semester or 4 quarter units.

Students who plan to transfer need to know which courses completed at Santa Monica College will be accepted at the college/university they plan to attend.

## CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY (CSU): U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION, AND AMERICAN IDEAS (AI) REQUIREMENT

The CSU U.S. History, Constitution, and American Ideals (AI) graduation requirement is not part of Cal-GETC. A course used to satisfy this requirement may also be listed and applied to Cal-GETC Subject Areas. CCCs may certify completion of the CSU graduation requirement in U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals. CSU campuses have the discretion on whether to allow courses not certified by CCC to satisfy the CSU United States History, Constitution and American Ideals graduation requirement to also count for GE.

## UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA: LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

The UC Language other than English (LOTE) graduation requirement is not part of Cal-GETC. Upon transfer to UC, a course that is approved to fulfill a Cal-GETC subject area may be used to satisfy the LOTE requirement if it meets relevant UC criteria

LOTE is a graduation requirement for UC students. Each UC and each major at the UC vary in what will fulfill this graduation requirement. It is not part of Cal-GETC and is not an admission requirement. **Please note:** Students who complete any part of their education between 9<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade at an institution where the language of instruction is other than English will not receive UC unit credit for courses taken at Santa Monica College in the same language.

## APPLYING NON-SMC COURSEWORK TO CAL-GETC

## A summary of requirements for CAL-GETC certification of non-SMC courses:

- 1. The institution is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges or an equivalent accrediting body.
- 2. A course taken at a California Community College is applied to the subject area in which it is listed by the institution where the work was completed (check ASSIST.org for college Cal-GETC lists).
- 3. Coursework from other U.S. regionally accredited institutions may be used on Cal-GETC. Coursework may be evaluated by a counselor.
- 4. The grade received in course is C (2.0) or higher. A grade of C- (C minus) is not acceptable. A "Credit" or "Pass" that is defined by institutional policy as being equivalent to a grade of C (2.0) or higher may be applied to Cal-GETC requirements.
- 5. Foreign coursework from non-United States regionally accredited institutions cannot be used for Cal-GETC.
- 6. Each course is a minimum of 3 semester or 4 quarter units.
- 7. All courses that meet Cal-GETC requirements are completed by the end of the semester that the student is petitioning for certification.
