GOVERNMENT/HISTORY CERTIFICATION

College of the Desert, pursuant to Section 40404 of Title 5 of the California Administrative Code and in accordance with Executive Order 405 from the Office of the Chancellor of California State University, certifies the following course/examination combinations as meeting the baccalaureate requirements in U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals at CSU, except that no student may meet the requirement by examinations alone. It is important to note that certification may take place if, and only if, an entire history and government combination has been completed. (Requirements at CSU institutions may vary; consult with your Faculty Advisor.)

A student may fulfill the history and government requirement by completing one course from each of the areas below (1 and 2).

1. Historical Development of American Institutions and Ideals: History 17 (or) History 18, and
2. Federal, State & Local Government Political Science 1

G.E. CERTIFICATION COURSE PATTERN

Each candidate for the Bachelor's Degree from a CSU institution is required to complete a pattern of general education courses with a minimum of 39 semester units. Thirteen courses in this pattern may be taken at College of the Desert. The remaining coursework is at the upper division level and must be completed at the campus granting the Bachelor's degree. General Education Certification must be requested by the student at the same time transcripts are requested to be sent to the transfer college or university.

COLLEGE OF THE DESERT PHYSICAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

Although not required for transfer to CSU, two units from kinesiology (KINE), health education (HE), recreation (RE) or varsity sports (VSM, VSW, VSO) are required to earn a degree from COD.

Note: KINE or HE courses used to fulfill section E, may not be used to fulfill this requirement.

COLLEGE OF THE DESERT COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS

Reading Competency: All students earning an Associate degree must demonstrate a reading proficiency at the collegiate level by passing RDG 51, Analytical Reading or the equivalent, with a grade of "C" or better.

Writing Competency: Students following the CSU GE pattern and also earning an Associate Degree must demonstrate a writing proficiency at the collegiate level by passing ENG 001A or the equivalent, with a "C" or better grade.

Mathematics Competency: Students following the CSU GE pattern and also earning an Associate Degree must demonstrate a mathematics proficiency at the collegiate level by passing any college mathematics course listed under 2-A on the IGETC list, with a "C" or better grade.

For AA-T or AS-T Degrees, per SB 1440, students do not need to complete the Physical Education or Reading requirements. Please refer to the COD catalog for further information
