- To satisfy this requirement students may choose Yuba Community College District English 1B or English 1C.
- These courses may “double count” to meet both CSUS English 20 graduation requirement and Critical Thinking, Area A3.

#### **FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY** – (May be double-counted in the CSU GE-B): May be met by any one of the following:

1. Completion of the third year of a foreign language in high school (grade of “C-” or better)
2. Graduation from a secondary school where the language of instruction was not English
3. Advanced Placement Foreign Language Examination scores of 3, 4, or 5; or
4. Completion of two semesters of a foreign language at a community college or university, with a grade of “C-” or better. Proficiency must be demonstrated at a level comparable to second semester (1B level) of college level (i.e. Spanish 2 at Yuba CC.)

#### **Exempt Majors:**

- If you have declared any of the following majors, then you are EXEMPT from the Foreign Language Graduation Requirement:
  - **Business Administration** – all concentrations
  - **Computer Science** – all concentrations
  - **Chemistry** – B.S. only
  - **Engineering** – all concentrations
  - **Health Sciences** – all concentrations
  - **Kinesiology** – Ex Sci only
  - **Nursing** – all concentrations
  - **Physics** – B.S. only
  - **Recreation, Parks, Tourism Administration**
