

# General Education (Breadth) Requirements

# CSU



Students transferring to the California State University system will qualify for admission as upper division transfers if they have completed (60) transferable units with a GPA of 2.0 ("C") or better (non-residents 2.4 or better). Within the (60) unit requirement, the (9) units in Area A, Area B-4 (Mathematics), and (18) additional semester units of general education coursework must be completed with a grade of 2.0 or better in each course. Students who complete the following pattern will have satisfied the lower division General Education requirements for the California State University BA/BS degree. A minimum of (9) semester units of General Ed coursework must be completed at the upper division level after transfer; some CSU campuses require more than (9) units. (See a counselor for further information.)

*(Students should request a general education certification from the office of Admissions and Records before transferring.)*
