Transfer Admission Eligibility: A transfer student will be required to complete 60 CSU transferable units with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 . Within the 60 units, 30 units must come from general education (GE), completed with a C grade or better, including the "golden 4", nine units from English composition, oral communications, critical thinking and three semester units from quantitative reasoning.
Certification: El Camino College will certify students who have completed the lower division general education requirements. Students who transfer without certification will be responsible for the transfer institution's general education pattern. Students who have completed courses at other colleges are advised to see a counselor regarding "pass-along" of courses. Foreign course work may not be used for certification on the CSU breadth requirements. For full certification, students must complete 12 units of general education at ECC. Requests for certification should be made during the student's final semester once student knows transfer university in the Admissions Office, online form https://elcamino.formstack.com/forms/req for certification
