CSU GE Certification Information:

- For admission, the CSU requires completion of the "Golden Four" which includes GE Areas: A1, A2, A3, and B4.
- Most CSU campuses require that all admission requirements (Golden 4, GPA, supplemental reqs) be completed by the end of spring term for fall admission but this may vary & is subject to change. Check https://www.calstate.edu/attend/student-services/casper/Pages/golden-four.aspx & the specific CSU campus website for the latest information.
- Although CSU GE Breadth allows for grades of C- or better, students with a C- in College Composition or Mathematics will not have met the competency requirements to graduate with an Associate Degree. In addition, a grade of C- in Mathematics might be insufficient for satisfying prerequisites for higher-level math and science courses.
- 4. **Double Counting:** A course cannot satisfy more than one GE area requirement even if it is listed in multiple areas.
- Credit will not be awarded for both the Honors and non-honors version of a course. Credit will be awarded only for the first course completed with a grade of "C" or better or "P."
- Credit for successfully passed AP/IB/CLEP exams may be applied to CSU GE with official test scores. See the OC catalog section on Credit for Prior Learning for more information.
- 7. Although grades of "P" (Pass) are allowed, some CSU's limit the number of units they will accept taken P/NP.

- 8. For a course to satisfy a CSU GE requirement, the course must be on the CSU GE Breadth list during the academic year when it is taken, at the college where it was taken.
- When substituting a course from another California Community
 College, check assist.org to verify the course was approved to meet
 CSU GE Breadth in that area at the college where the course was
 taken; in the year it was taken.
- Courses from other U.S. regionally accredited institutions may be used
 if the student provides official transcripts & if the course is determined
 to be equivalent to a course in OC's CSU GE Breadth through the
 pass along process. Syllabi or course outlines may be required.
- Certification is not automatic and must be requested in the Counseling Office
- Full Certification All areas completed with a minimum of 39 units. Students with full certification will only be responsible for 9 units of upper division GE at the CSU after transfer.
- 13. Partial GE Certification It is possible to complete separately any of the Areas (A-E) and receive partial certification before transfer. It will be necessary to complete the remaining areas after transfer. However, A1, A2, A3, B4 are required for admission, and students with partial certification may be subject to additional lower division GE requirements at the CSU.
