Courses must be on the CSU GE-B at the time the course was taken. ●Courses taken in person or online at other community colleges will be applied to CSU GE-B according to how they were approved at the college and semester where completed. ●Woodland Community College and Yuba College do not share CSU GE-B patterns. If taking a course in person or online at YC, check to see what area it satisfies on YC’s pattern. ● Courses listed in more than one area may only be used once except for courses in US History, Constitution and American Ideals. ● Advanced Placement (AP) exams completed with a score of 3, 4, or 5 may be applied to the CSU GE-B. #### **FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY – (May be double-counted in the CSU GE-B): May be met by any one of the following:**

1. Completion of the third year of a foreign language in high school (grade of “C-” or better). Official High School transcript required.
2. Graduation from a secondary school where the language of instruction was not English.
3. Advanced Placement Foreign Language Examination scores of 3, 4, or 5.
4. Completion of two semesters of a foreign language at a community college or university, with a grade of “C-” or better. Proficiency must be demonstrated at a level comparable to the second semester (1B level) of college level language (i.e. Spanish 2 at Yuba CCD).

#### **Exempt Majors:**

- If you have declared any of the following majors, then you are EXEMPT from the Foreign Language Graduation Requirement:
  - **Business Administration** – all concentrations
  - **Computer Science** – all concentrations
  - **Chemistry** – B.S. only
  - **Engineering** – all concentrations
  - **Kinesiology** – Ex Sci only
  - **Nursing** – all concentrations
  - **Public Health** – all concentrations
  - **Physics** – B.S. only
  - **Recreation, Parks, Tourism Administration = Hospitality and Tourism Management BS; Recreation Administration BS; Recreation Therapy BS**
