Voter Guide

This guide provides a list of all eligible candidates running for the ASI Board of Directors Run-Off Elections for 2026-2027. There is a run-off election for Senator, College of Business & Economics (CBE). This occurs when no candidate that was running received a majority of the votes (50% + 1 vote). Thus, the 2 candidates with the highest amount of votes moves into a run-off election. Given that it is for a College Senator, only CBE students are eligible to vote in this specific run-off election.

This election runs from Monday, April 13, 2026, at 8am through Tuesday, April 14, 2026, at 11:59pm. After this run-off concludes and there is a winning candidate, the full ASI Board of Directors for 2026-2027 elections will be certified. When ASI has any vacant positions after the election process, there will be an open application and appointment to fill any vacant positions. We encourage you to read about each candidate and see how they will work to represent you! ASI also wants to ensure that all students feel represented and heard as part of your membership. This run-off election is only for students within the College of Business & Economics.
