<i>1. Which PLO(s) to assess</i>	With the permission of AD Sarah Neilsen, the HDEV faculty decided to assess our existing PLOs to determine whether they reflected diversity and equity in the curriculum. In 2021-22, the faculty will return to the traditional model of assessing one PLO annually.

Sampling Procedure: Examination of existing PLOs.

The faculty assessed each PLO for diversity and cultural inclusivity. Using this lens, we strove to understand:

- What still works in the PLO
- What no longer works in the PLO
- What PLOs need more unpacking to better reflect our definition of diversity.

Recommendations for Program Improvement: The department faculty determined that the PLOs should be modified to more accurately and appropriately reflect the significance of diversity within Human Development's learning outcomes. The pre-existing PLOs are stated directly below:
