0-99:	remedial courses (generally, 80-99 will be used) and courses with such numbers shall not be eligible for baccalaureate credit.
100-299	lower division courses
300-499	upper division courses
500-599	post-baccalaureate (including credential) or professional oriented courses
600-699	master's level courses
700-799	doctoral level courses
900-999	may be used for record keeping purposes for transfer courses that are not articulated with CSUEB courses
