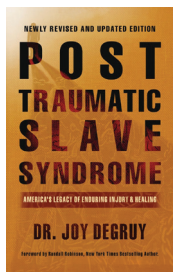


Julie Murphy

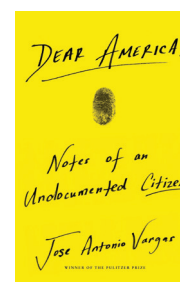


Joy DeGruy
