

## **BS Hospitality and Tourism + MS Hospitality, Recreation, and Tourism FAST Programs (25-26)**

**Note:** In 26-27, there are no concentrations in the BS Hospitality and Tourism degree and no concentrations in the MS HRT degree. In 25-26, there were 3 concentrations plus a no concentration option in the BS Hospitality and Tourism degree. The FAST program supports all bachelor's degree concentrations.

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**Total FAST Program Units (BS + MS) 120+18 = 138**

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### **Hospitality and Tourism, B.S. Program (120 units)**

#### **Degree Requirements Unit-Outline**

- *A baccalaureate of science degree requires a total of 120 units:*
  - *The major requirements consist of 60 units;*
  - *General Education (GE) & Graduation Requirements (GR) consist of 52 units;*
  - *Free Electives may consist of 8 units (actual number of free elective units may depend on GE/GR units).*

**Note: It may be possible to double-count units within the graduation requirements or that a course may satisfy both a graduation requirement and a major requirement. Students should contact their program advisors for information.**

#### **Hospitality and Tourism Major Requirements (60 units)**

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#### **HRT Foundational Core (11 units)**

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The 23 units of HRT Foundational Core represents the core coursework that every undergraduate student in the Hospitality, Recreation and Tourism department must complete in addition to their Major Core, Concentration, and Electives to equal 60 units.

- **HOS 100 - Professional Preparation Units: 2**
- **HOS 400 - Introduction to Finance in Hospitality, Recreation, Recreation Therapy, and Tourism Units: 3**
- **REC 100 - Introduction to Recreation and Recreation Therapy Units: 3 ; Breadth Area: GE-4; Diversity**
- **REC 200 - Serving Diverse Populations in Hospitality, Recreation, Rec Therapy and Tourism Units: 3 ; Breadth Area: GE-4; Social Justice**

## **Hospitality and Tourism Major Core (25 units)**

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The Hospitality and Tourism major core consists of 25 units of specific courses that lay a broad foundation in the hospitality and tourism industry, including a 400 hour internship.

- *HOS 200 - Lodging Management Units: 3*
- *HOS 205 - Travel and Tourism Units: 3 ; Breadth Area: GE-4; Social Justice*
- *HOS 210 - Meetings, Conventions, & Special Events Units: 3*
- *HOS 215 - Food and Beverage Management Units: 3*
- *HOS 225 - Technology in Hospitality and Tourism Units: 3*
- *HOS 410 - Revenue Management in Hospitality and Tourism Units: 3*
- *HOS 475 - Internship Placement Units: 1*
- *HOS 498 - Internship Units: 6*

## **FAST Program Courses**

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Students must complete four (4) courses of the following for 12 units:

- *REC 610 - Strategic Leadership and Ethics in HRT Units: 3*
- *REC 630 - Advanced Data-Driven Decision Making in HRT Units: 3*
- *REC 640 - Law and Risk in HRT Units: 3*
- *REC 670 - Advanced Marketing in HRT Units: 3*

## **Concentrations (12 units)**

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To complete the degree, choose one of four pathways: Either no concentration or one of the three concentrations that emphasize personal goals. All pathways will have Elective coursework with the approval of an advisor.

- *Hospitality and Tourism, B.S. (No Concentration- 12 units of elective coursework chosen with advisor)*
- *Hospitality and Tourism, B.S.: Event Planning and Management Concentration*
- *Hospitality and Tourism, B.S.: Food and Beverage Concentration*
- *Hospitality and Tourism, B.S.: Lodging, Resort, and Club Management Concentration*

## **Elective Coursework**

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Students choosing the No Concentration pathway will be required to successfully complete 12 units of Elective coursework with advisor approval to total 60 units for the major.

## **Event Planning and Management Concentration**

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The event planning and management concentration is ideal for those who seek a career in the event planning industry.

### **Required Coursework**

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The following 9 units are required:

- *HOS 310 - Design & Management of Special Events in Hospitality and Tourism* Units: 3
- *HOS 315 - Wedding Planning* Units: 3
- *HOS 320 - Event Leadership* Units: 3

### **Electives**

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Plus, successfully complete 3 units of Elective coursework with advisor approval to total 12 units for the concentration and 60 units for the major.

## **Food and Beverage Concentration**

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The food and beverage concentration is perfect for those seeking a career in restaurant management or food and beverage industry.

### **Required Coursework**

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The following 9 units are required:

- *HOS 297 - Food & Culture* Units: 3 ; *Breadth Area: GE-4; Social Justice*
- *HOS 335 - Introduction to Wine, Beer and Spirits* Units: 3
- *HOS 340 - Menu Planning, Cost Control, and Purchasing* Units: 3

### **Electives**

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Plus, successfully complete 3 units of Elective coursework with advisor approval to total 12 units for the concentration and 60 units for the major.

## **Lodging, Resort, and Club Management Concentration**

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The lodging, resort, and club management concentration is ideal for those who seek a career in the hotel or lodging industry or country club type atmosphere.

## **Required Coursework**

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The following 9 units are required:

- **HOS 350 - Resort and Club Management** *Units: 3*
- **HOS 355 - Advanced Lodging Management** *Units: 3*
- **HOS 360 - Lodging Alternatives** *Units: 3*

## **Electives**

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Plus, successfully complete 3 units of Elective coursework with advisor approval to total 12 units for the concentration and 60 units for the major.

## **Other Undergraduate Degree Requirements**

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In addition to major requirements, every student must also complete the University's baccalaureate requirements for graduation, which are described in the [Undergrad Baccalaureate & Program Requirements](#) chapter of this catalog.

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## **Hospitality, Recreation and Tourism Degree, M.S. Program (18 units)**

- REC 697 - Special Issues in Hospitality, Recreation and Tourism *Units: 1-3*

### **Other Graduate & Post-Baccalaureate Degree Requirements**

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In addition to departmental requirements, every student must also satisfy the University requirements for graduation as described throughout this catalog. These include the 70% unit residence requirement; the five-year rule on currency of subject matter; the minimum number of units in 600-level courses; the “C” minimum grade for each graduate course; and the 3.00 grade point average in all units counted towards the degree.
