Undergraduate Degree Admission Requirements

Freshmen

- **Proof of English Proficiency:** TOEFL (ibt) 61 / IELTS 6.0 / PTE 44 / SAT 550 (Verbal)
- 12 years Elementary + Secondary Schooling with minimum 3.0 GPA or B
- certificate of completion of secondary education

How to Apply

- 1. Apply online at www.calstate.edu/apply
 - Pay \$70 non-refundable application fee
- 2. Submit the following documents:
 - Official academic records (transcripts should be in original language with English translation, if needed)
 - Official test scores, if required
 - TOEFL code= 4011
 - IELTS score should be sent to California State University, East Bay International Admissions
- 3. If admitted, F-1 students must provide verification of **finances** to cover the total amount listed below

Merit-based Scholarships for F-1 students

Global Excellence Scholarship-full non-resident tuition waiver awards (\$12,500 per year) for first time freshman students who:

- Display exceptional scholastic ability and prior academic achievement (determined by high school GPA of 3.3 or higher, standardized tests (SAT/ACT or AP), and essay)
- Demonstrate Financial Need
- Commit to enrolling in 15 units per semester

Global Honors Scholarship- partial tuition waiver awards (\$2,500+) for one year of undergradate study:

- Minimum 3.3 grade point average
- Completed fewer than 75 semester units at the time of application
- Demonstrate Financial Need in application essay
- Commit to enrolling in 15 units per semester

CSUEB will also waive English proficiency tests for students who pass the Year 12 English Exam with A2 level (or 84 or higher.)
