Machu Picchu was just one piece of the great Empire built by the Incas. The Inca Empire spanned over 1800 miles along South America, and 23,100 feet in elevation. The achievements of the Inca Empire are remarkable especially considering it existed for less than 100 years. The Incas succeeded by drawing on over 5,000 years of cultural tradition in the Andean region. Not only is



the success of the Incas apparent in the ruins that still stand today, but also in the rituals and traditions still practiced by contemporary Andean people.
