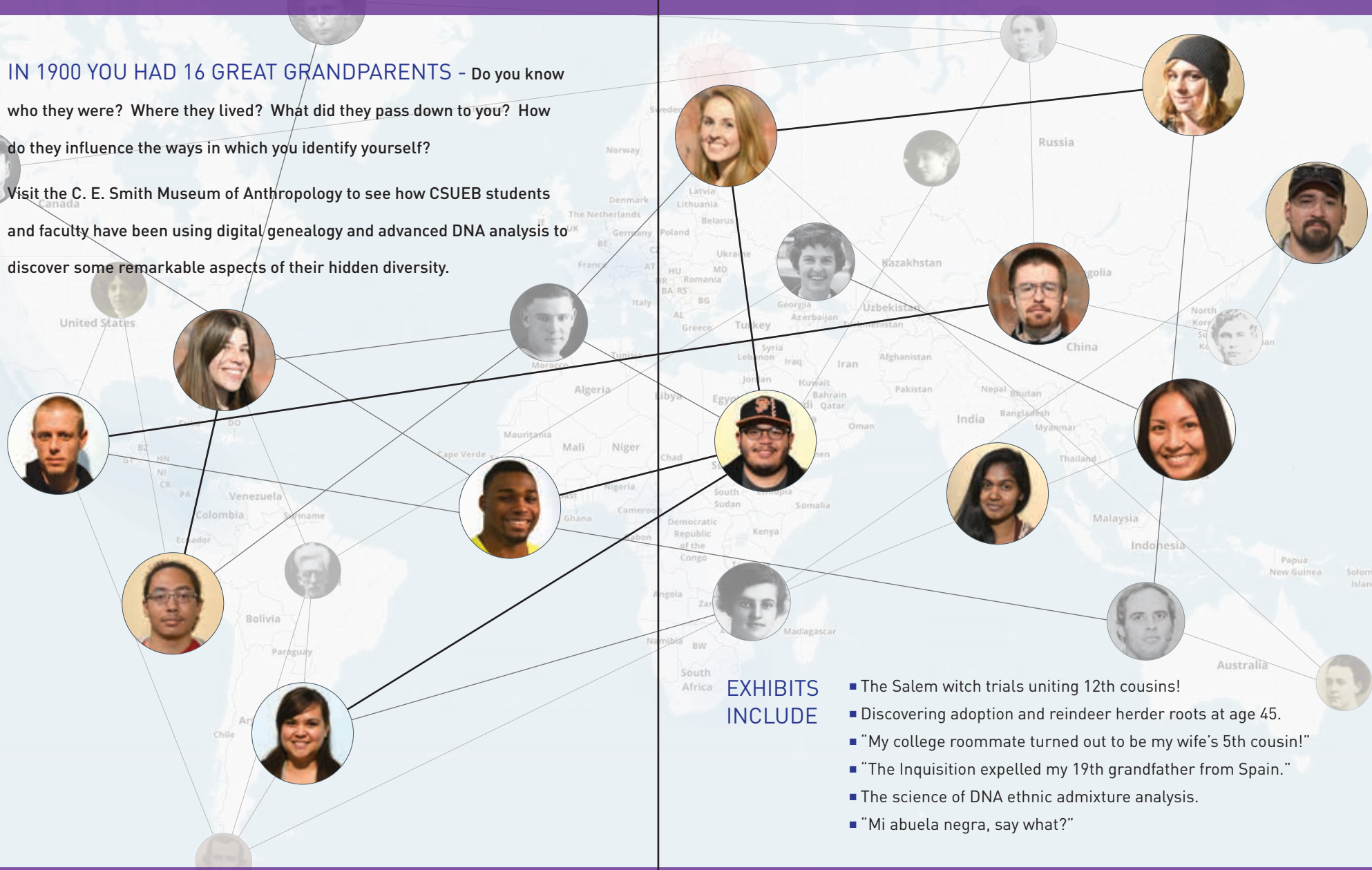


THERE IS MORE TO US THAN MEETS THE EYE...
