How Do I Apply to Ohlone College AS in Nursing Program?

Application to the program can only be obtained by attending one of the mandatory pre-nursing orientations scheduled prior to the application period. Please check our website for dates. Applications can be submitted every year between January 15-March 1 for admission in the following Fall and Spring semesters. Admission Requirements for Ohlone College:

Ohlone Community College has a four semester Associate of Science Degree in Nursing (ADN) program. Students are admitted twice a year in the fall and spring semester. Program admission is contingent upon meeting all minimum requirements. To be eligible for admission, students must complete the following prerequisite courses by the application period: English 101A, Anatomy theory and lab BIO 103A or equivalent, Physiology theory and lab BIO 103B or equivalent, Microbiology theory and lab BIO 106 or equivalent, COMM 111(Public Speaking) or COMM 113 (Interpersonal Communication) or equivalent, CFS 109 Nutrition or equivalent course, and PSY 108 Developmental Psychology or equivalent.

GPA Requirements for Ohlone College Nursing Program:

A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 is required for core courses English & Science (Anatomy, Physiology and Microbiology)

ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) Requirements for Ohlone College:

A minimum composite score of 62% on the ATI TEAS on the **first** attempt. Scores on the second or subsequent attempts do not count.

How Do I Apply to Cal State East Bay's Post-Licensure Collaborative program?

The Post-Licensure Collaborative Advanced Placement Option is a 12 month intensive or 2 year part-time program. All courses are on-line except for the Community Health practicum. The program begins in the fall term after completion of the ADN program and passing the RN licensing exam (NCLEX). Incoming ADN students will be awarded 15 upper division college credit units for passing the NCLEX-RN exam.

Eligibility: 1) Enrollment in an ADN program & 2) Meet all Cal State East Bay admission requirements
