



Franklin Lowenthal, Professor Emeritus of the Department of Accounting and Finance, Passed Away March 3, 2018

Franklin Lowenthal, Professor Emeritus of the Department of Accounting and Finance (formerly Accounting and CIS), passed away March 3, 2018. He began his career at CSU, Hayward (East Bay) in 1979 and finished participation in the Faculty Early Retirement Program in 2012.

Professor Franklin (Frank) Lowenthal was an Emeritus Professor of Computer Information Systems and joined the faculty at CSUH in 1979 after earning his Ph.D. in Mathematics from Stanford University in 1965. Frank taught Accounting Information Systems courses, Managerial and Cost Accounting and several Management courses in the Department of Accounting and CIS. He developed expertise on object oriented program and design and database management. He later taught Legal Environment of Business during his years in FERP and greatly enjoyed teaching the course discussing many aspects of the current legal issues and cases with students. Frank served on the Academic Senate and many department committees during his years at CSUH. He published extensively in his field. Frank was a championship bridge player and an avid runner for decades. He also loved the Yankees for his entire life. Frank is survived by his wife Ann of 52 years and their son David Lowenthal, his wife Jennie Sparrow, and granddaughter Rachel; and daughter Debbie Lowenthal, her husband Benjamin Carney, and grandchildren Portia and Matthias.
