

MS-HCA DEGREE-COMPLETION ROADMAP Fall Admission Cohorts

Program Overview: The MS-HCA program requires the completion of seven four-unit graduate courses and one six-unit graduate course, for a total of thirty-four semester units. Each semester is 15 weeks long and we offer courses in the Fall and Spring semesters only. We do not accept transfer or substitution courses for any of the eight required courses. You must maintain an overall GPA of 3.00 (B average) or better in the program, and earn a grade of C or better in all courses.
