MPA DEGREE-COMPLETION ROADMAP

<u>Program Overview</u>: The program requires the completion of eight four-unit graduate courses for a total of thirty-two semester units. Each semester is 15 weeks long and MPA courses are offered in the fall and spring semesters only. We do not accept transfer or substitution courses for any of the eight required courses. Students must maintain an overall GPA of 3.00 (B average) or better in the program, and earn a grade of C or better in each course. Failure to meet this requirement results in placement on academic probation.

MPA students have two concentration options: Public Management and Policy Analysis (PMPA) and Health Care Administration (HCA). PMPA students complete PA 631 and PA 641 in their 3rd semester. HCA students complete HCA 611 and HCA 612 in their 3rd semester if starting the program in fall. HCA students starting in spring complete HCA 611/612 in their 2nd semester and PA 621/622 in their 3rd semester.
