## STUDENT SAFETY IN THE LABORATORY-Engineering Lab Prepared by CSUEB Department of Engineering

- 1. All safety precautions shall be followed at all times.
- 2. Horseplay will not be permitted at any time in the lab.
- 3. Students are responsible for knowing the location and correct use of all safety equipment in the lab.
- 4. There must be two people I the lab at all times while students are operating equipment. NO ONE may work alone!!
- 5. No equipment may be operated without express permission of the lab attendant, teaching assistant or faculty member.
- 6. Student shall be familiar with all safety devices, interlocks, and emergency stop devices prior to operation of any equipment.
- 7. Safety glasses shall be worn whenever matching operations are in progress.
- 8. All Safety devices and shields shall be in place and operating properly prior to operating any equipment.
- 9. Do not distract anyone who is operating any equipment.
- 10. Safety zones shall be established around all moving equipment prior to its operation.
- 11. Personnel are not permitted inside of safety zone at any time while equipment is in operation.
- 12. Students shall not run any unauthorized experiments or programs in the lab.
- 13. All unsafe conditions shall be immediately reported to the lab attendant, teaching assistant, or faculty member responsible for the lab. <u>If unavailable, contact the University Police Department (UPD) at 510-885-3791.</u>
- 14. Report ALL injuries to the lab attendant, teaching assistant, faculty member responsible for the lab.
- 15. Think before connecting power supplies. Even low voltages can be dangerous. If in doubt ask the instructor to verify your intended connections before applying power.
- 16. No liquids around exposed circuits or computer keyboards or monitors. Liquids are generally conductive and will damage the equipment. You may be held responsible for such damage.
- 17. Tools and product samples can have sharp edges and should be used only for their intended functions.
- 18. Keep aisles clear and do not put wires where people need to walk.
- 19. Rolling chairs, and some types of footwear can generate enormous static electrical changes. Such charges can destroy electronic circuits. Please ground yourself before making contact with equipment, or other persons.
- 20. If you have a cell phone, program the campus emergency number, (510) 885-3333 into it under "campus police" or "campus safety".
- 21. In the event of an emergency, dial 911 from any campus phone to reach UPD. UPD can be reached at x5-3333.
