<p>Degree Requirements</p> <p>Students must complete 120 total units for the degree, which includes General Education (GE) requirements, university requirements, and major requirements. In addition to the required courses, students may need additional units to reach 120 units. Students should meet with their assigned College of Health Academic Advisor to confirm how many actual units are needed based on overall academic history and to verify any pending unit/GE requirements. If additional units are needed, a list of recommended elective courses for SLHS majors can be found here.</p>

SLHS 300 fulfills the upper-division General Education (GE) UD-4 Area and the ASHA Social Science Area. 3. SLHS 303 fulfills the upper-division General Education (GE) UD-5 Area and the ASHA Physical Science Area. 4. SLHS 401 fulfills the upper-division General Education (GE) UD-5 Area and the ASHA Biological Science Area. 5. The Area courses should meet the criteria set by ASHA. 6. SLHS 497 can be taken up to two times. Topics vary each year. 7. SLHS 496 is a variable unit research experience course (1-3 units), which can be taken multiple times. By permission only. 8. SLHS 306W fulfills the upper-division General Education (GE) UD-4 Area, Diversity overlay, and University Writing Requirement (UWR).
