## SUMMER ENTRY: Recommended for candidates who do not hold a teaching credential

## FALL ENTRY: Recommended for candidates who currently hold a teaching credential (Candidates who do not hold a teaching credential may enter in the Fall as well)

The Educational Specialist Credential Mild/Moderate Support Needs or Extensive Support Needs meets all Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) standards as well as the 2014 supervisor/ support CLAD certification and the Autism Spectrum Disorders Added Authorization. Meets the CTC requirements for overlapping skill and knowledge development across the authorization areas of Mild to Moderate Support needs and Extensive Support needs. Candidates may enter to complete only the Autism Added Authorization.

This two year program leads to the recommendation of the Preliminary Education Specialist Credential and Master of Science in Special Education Degree. Candidates will select a concentration are in either Mild/Moderate Support Needs or Extensive Support Needs.
