Subject: Alternative Transportation Committee Recommended Composition

Action Requested: That the Campus Sustainability Committee formally recommend positions that compose the Cal State East Bay Alternative Transportation Committee.

OVERVIEW:

As of March 3, 2020, the California State University (CSU) System adopted a Transportation and Parking Policy.¹ This policy states:

“Each campus shall establish and maintain an Alternative Transportation Committee. This committee shall be responsible for analyzing and evaluating the campus' existing transportation programs and challenges and recommending plans and strategies to increase equitable access and cost-effective transportation options. This committee shall remain independent from existing campus parking committees.”

Currently, Cal State East Bay does not have a formal governing body for campus alternative transportation decisions. Such decisions are managed by the Parking and Alternative Transportation Services Department, which is where the mandated Alternative Transportation Committee would reside.

Since the Campus Sustainability Committee (CSC) is the formal Cal State East Bay recommending body for all sustainability-related issues on campus, and the Director of Parking and Alternative Services is an ex-officio member of the CSC, the Office of Sustainability requests that the CSC formally recommends a composition of positions to be members of the Cal State East Bay Alternative Transportation Committee. The proposed composition was drafted using the Alternative Transportation Committee Charter Template² as a guide.

PROPOSED COMPOSITION:

- Director of Parking and Alternative Transportation Services (PATS)
- Alternative Transportation Lead from PATS
- Director of Student Housing and Residence Life
- Director of Sustainability
- Faculty representation
 - Chair of Ad Hoc Sustainability Committee of the Academic Senate (CAHS), or designee from CAHS
 - One faculty representative from the Campus Sustainability Committee
 - 2 faculty representatives, two-year term (recommended by the Senate)
- 2 staff representatives, two-year term
- Two students recommended by ASI
 - One representative from the Chancellor's Office (non-voting)
