Aging, Long Term Care, and Elder/Dependent Adult Abuse - 10 Hours for those who entered a degree program on or after 1/1/2004

Child Abuse Assessment and Reporting	The coursework or training in child abuse assessment and reporting shall consist of not less than 7 classroom hours and shall include training in each of the subject areas described in Section 28 of the [Business and Professions Code – BPC] Code. Section 28 text: Include the study of the assessment and method of reporting of sexual assault, neglect, severe neglect, general neglect, willful cruelty or unjustifiable punishment, corporal punishment or injury, and abuse in out-of-home care. The training shall also include physical and behavioral indicators of abuse, crisis counseling techniques, community resources, rights and responsibilities of reporting, consequences of failure to report, caring for a child's needs after a report is made, sensitivity to previously abused children and adults, and implications and methods of treatment for children and adults. 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Suicide Risk Assessment & Intervention	On or after January 1, 2021, an applicant for licensure as a clinical social worker shall show, as part of the application, that he or she has completed a minimum of six hours of coursework or applied experience under supervision in suicide risk assessment and intervention	Note for students who graduated prior to 2020: This content was not tracked prior to 2020; you may need to complete a CEU course in this area. Telehealth (provision of Mental Health Services)	On or after July 1, 2023, an applicant for licensure as a clinical social worker shall show, as part of the application, that they have completed a minimum of three hours of training or coursework in the provision of mental health services via Telehealth	Note for students who graduated prior to 2023: This content was not tracked prior to 2023; you may need to complete a CEU course in this area. Total hours CMH: 3 (2023 and later grads completed) Total hours CYF: 3 (2025 and later grads completed) AP2 (CMH) (3 Hours): Students have 3 GoReact video/telehealth based assignments and we cover the basics of ethics of telehealth, consent for recording, consent for telehealth in lecture. We also address Telehealth issues in two supplemental course readings. AP2 (CYF): (3 hours) Combination of video and in-classroom training covering ethics and practice considerations in telehealth.
