

The 23-year-old Dizon, who directed and choreographed the production and stars as the White Rabbit, is graduating this year with a theatre arts major dance option. He has collaborated in the past with faculty and students on several projects, including the Winter Wonderland student dance showcase, as requireed for a senior project.

But Dizon wanted to do more.

"It is very rare that a student asks for permission to be in charge of an entire project, instead of just having a solo in a collaborative effort," said Haft, "but (Dizon) is more motivated, more ambitious than that. He is completely absorbed and truly passionate about this show.


