New Program Emphasizes Professionalism

"The new professional development program in Contra Costa is emphasizing learning community," Silverman said. "We are relying upon early care professionals to support and help one another to get information, fill out forms, return to school, succeed in school, etc."

Students seeking scholarships must also complete the university admission requirements by taking 20 lower-division quarter units from categories such as anthropology, human biology and physical anthropology, child and human development, ethnic or area studies, psychology and sociology.

In addition, they must complete a minimum of 90 quarter units with 45 of those units taken in general education courses such as oral and written communication, critical thinking and transferable math. California residents must have a GPA of 2.0 and non-residents must have a GPA of 2.4 to enroll. Scholarship applications are being accepted until June 30.

Silverman added that a lot of mechanisms have been put into

place to make the options possible, including advisors, community point people and other resources.

"This is a part of that whole ideal system," Silverman said. "The way that CSUEB designed the program will definitely move that dream forward and further support the move to professionalize the early care system. Providers will benefit by having a program at their fingertips that never was available before, children will benefit by better educated teachers, and the community will benefit by having such positive role models."
