As is tradition, this family production also will be performed for school-age groups that have made advanced arrangements to attend morning performances Monday, Dec. 17 through Thursday, Dec. 20.

"Audiences can expect an international holiday experience," said Thomas Hird, chair of Cal State East Bay's Theatre and Dance Department.
