"Charlotte's Web" Is Spun by CSUEB Thespians

ocal residents who may have missed the recently released film of "Charlotte's Web" now have an opportunity to see a live action version of the tale right in their own backyard.

Cal State East Bay's Theatre and Dance Department will be staging its own production of E.B. White's classic children's story at the University Theatre tomorrow and Saturday.

The play will be directed by A. Fajilan, who said of the production, "Children of all ages will find something to smile about."

White, a prolific author perhaps best known for his popular guide to writing, "Elements of Style," wrote the book on which the play is based in 1952. "Charlotte's Web" went on to become the best-selling children's book of all time.

The tale, described by its author as "a story of friendship and salvation on a farm," has formed the basis for two feature length movies, an animated film released in 1973 and last year's version—a combination of live-action and computer animation.

"This is only Fajilan's first year, but already I see her inspiring students and faculty alike to wonderful and imaginative ideas for her shows," said Thomas Hird, the chair of CSUEB's Department of Theatre

The CSUEB version of the play will feature puppets and live actors ranging in age from children to those in their sixties.

"I'm sure children will enjoy the playful puppets and 'climbing Charlotte' the cast and crew are creating for our unique production," Hird

Performances have been scheduled for 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday night in the University Theatre, 25800 Carlos Bee Blvd., Hayward. In addition, a matinee performance

is scheduled for 2 p.m. on Saturday. Benjamin Bowser, the interim

espite the small size of the music department at Cal State East Bay, students walked away with high honors and first place awards

from the Reno Jazz Festival last weekend.

The Jazz Festival is the largest competition of its kind on the West Coast. Performance categories included Jazz Ensemble and Jazz Combo.

CSUEB Jazz Combo 1 took first place

among four-year colleges and Jazz Combo 2 took third. Both performed under the direction of Dann Zinn.

CSUEB Jazz Ensemble took first place and the Jazz Workshop fourth place. The Jazz Ensemble and Workshop were directed by Dave Eshelman.

"This was a clean sweep. CSUEB won first prize in every collegiate category: soloists, big band and combos," said Frank La Rocca, music department chair.

"This is remarkable in itself, but when you consider our small size as a department relative to other campuses, this is nothing less than extraordinary. But then, jazz has a long history of excellence at CSUEB. Bravo to all our students!"
