The 2010-11 season includes "Antigone," conceived and directed by Darryl V. Jones; "Ice," the annual extravaganza of dance and song; "Scroogie: A Modern Musical Carol," loosely based on Charles Dickens' holiday classic; "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum," music by Stephen Sonheim, book by Larry Gelbart; "Seven Deadly Sings and the CSUEB Dance Ensemble," music by Kurt Weill, book by Bertholt Brecht; the annual faculty dance concert, and "Performance Fusion," theatre and dance students' final projects.
